

I am a scholarship recipient of the Masovian Scholarship Program for gifted students in the 2025/2026 school year. As part of this project, I prepared and presented a presentation entitled "Prague Through My Eyes" to the sixth-grade students of our school and conducted a quiz among the sixth-grade students to see what they remembered from my presentation. In this report, I would like to present the results of the quiz and draw conclusions from the students' responses.

## Quiz Results

Students from grades 6a and 6b (12 participants) participated in the quiz.

The vast majority of students (83.3%) know that the river that flows through Prague is the Vltava, although 16.7% incorrectly identified the Danube. A full 91.7% of students correctly identified the famous bridge in Prague as the Charles Bridge, while only 8.3% incorrectly identified the Czech Bridge. 91.7% of sixth-grade students knew the color of the famous roofs of Prague's historic buildings, and the same percentage knew that Prague is located in the Czech Republic and that Prague Castle is home to the famous St. Vitus Cathedral. 75% of students knew the colors of the Czech flag—white, red, and blue—although other colors dominated in 25% of responses. When asked why Prague is called the "City of a Hundred Spires," almost all answered correctly. Another open-ended question, "What do you remember most from the presentation about Prague?" shows that the students carefully watched my presentation and remembered Charles Bridge, the Vltava River, historic buildings, and St. Vitus Cathedral. When asked if you would like to go on a trip to Prague in 7th grade, 58% of students answered YES, citing the beautiful views, a desire to learn more about the Czech Republic, and the red rooftops. 16.6% were undecided, and 25.4% answered firmly NO.

## Conclusions:

The quiz I conducted in sixth grade shows that the students have a good understanding of the most important attractions in Prague. They performed best on questions about what they remembered from my presentation about Prague and the color of the famous roofs of historic buildings. Questions about the colors of the Czech flag and the river that flows through Prague proved slightly more challenging. Most of the students expressed interest in participating in a trip to Prague, demonstrating the high level of interest in this city and its tourist attractions. The results confirm that my presentation was interesting, understandable, and effectively expanded the participants' knowledge.

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
